

SELF-EVALUATION QUESTIONS for the MAOZ PROGRAMME

1. There is a wide variety of topics that you have been introduced to since the start of the programme. These include among others the IDF; the Holocaust; Israel's elections; Theodor Herzl: The Movie; dealing with anti-semitism and anti-Zionism on the university campuses; the Jewish National Fund; criticizing Israel as a democracy; Jewish values; Israel's claim to the land.

On a scale of 1 – 5, with 1 being the lowest score and 5 being the highest, rate these and other topics not mentioned but covered according to:

How useful they were/are to you

How informative they were

How interesting they were

How, if at all, they altered your perceptions of Israel and Judaism

2. Suggest one or more Jewish/Zionist topics that have not yet been dealt with, but which interest you and about which you would like to learn more.

3. Is there any topic that has been covered that was of special interest to you? If so, name it.

4. Would you like any one of the topics that have been presented to you to be repeated in greater detail? If so, name it.

5. Most of the speakers have been local, with only a few international ones. On a scale of 1 – 5, with 1 being the lowest score and 5 being the highest, rate the interest engendered in you by the local speakers
On a scale of 1 – 5, with 1 being the lowest score and 5 being the highest, rate the interest engendered in you by the international speakers

6. On a scale of 1 – 5, with 1 being the lowest score and 5 being the highest, rate the suitability of the environment in which the lectures took place.

7. What changes, if any, would you propose to the environment in which the lectures took place?

8. On a scale of 1 – 5, with 1 being the lowest score and 5 being the highest, rate your familiarity with Israel advocacy.

9. On a scale of 1 – 5, with 1 being the lowest score and 5 being the highest, rate your familiarity with Israeli society, including your knowledge of the divide between Haredim and secular Jews

10. On a scale of 1 – 5, with 1 being the lowest score and 5 being the highest, rate your familiarity with Jewish identity

12. On a scale of 1 – 5, with 1 being the lowest score and 5 being the highest, rate your familiarity with current South Africa / Israel relations

13. On a scale of 1 – 5, with 1 being the lowest score and 5 being the highest, rate your familiarity with the events of the Holocaust

14. On a scale of 1 – 5, with 1 being the lowest score and 5 being the highest, rate your familiarity with the aid that Israel gives around the world in times of natural disasters.
